After years of developing enzyme immunoassays (EIAs) for pharmaceutical and biotechnology companies, Dr. MacLean founded Science with a Mission to use her skills to develop low-cost, appropriate diagnostic tests for common diseases in the developing world (malaria, typhoid, dengue, etc.). This seminar will focus on the development of a rapid diagnostic test for malaria—from production of polyclonal and monoclonal antibodies, conjugation of antibodies to dyed latex micro particles, and striping antibodies on membranes to preparing sample and conjugate release pads. Highlights of programs where these tests are being used in Mexico, Haiti, the Democratic Republic of Congo and Nepal will be given.
