According to the WHO, more than a billion people do not have acceptable access to an adequate supply of safe drinking water; furthermore, the UN estimates the cost of a village water project at more than \$50 per person. The seminar at UAB will focus on building practical skills that uses low-cost approaches for testing water in resource-constrained settings. It will be supplemented with background information on water testing (regulations, what to test for, accuracy of results, field equipment, etc.) The workshop at SIFAT is an intensive two-day training to build skills in using appropriate technologies for water and sanitation projects in the field. Participants also acquire skills in conducting community health education in water and sanitation.
