William Nsubuga moved to the United States as a political refugee after surviving the Rwandan genocide. In 1997, he attended SIFAT's community development training. He lived in Birmingham for the next 10 years, never forgetting what he learned at SIFAT and never losing his desire to help HIV/AIDS orphans in Africa. In 2007, William completed further SIFAT training in preparation for his move to Uganda to start an orphanage to care for these children.

In 2008, William founded Agape Total Childcare Center in Lugazi, Uganda. He opened the doors to children, ages 6 to 12, who lost one or both parents to HIV/AIDS. William envisioned Agape being a Christian home for these children, a place where they could be safe, feel loved, attend school and receive medical attention when needed. He eventually wanted to open a Christian boarding school for both the residents of Agape and area students. Tuition will be charged to attend the school, and these funds will help the orphanage become self-sustaining.

In Lugazi, the living space was limited and in an unsafe neighborhood. This environment was not conducive to the children's safety, academic growth or well-being. William was able to buy land in nearby Mukono, and in 2011, the first SIFAT mission team arrived to begin building facilities for the new Agape Total Childcare Center. In 2012, Agape Christian Academy opened for secondary day students. Teams are needed to complete the Agape Total Childcare Center, which includes an administration building, dormitories, a chapel, housing for teachers and a Christian secondary boarding school. However, Agape is more than just buildings, it gives these children hope and an opportunity for their future.
