and outgrow facility's capacity

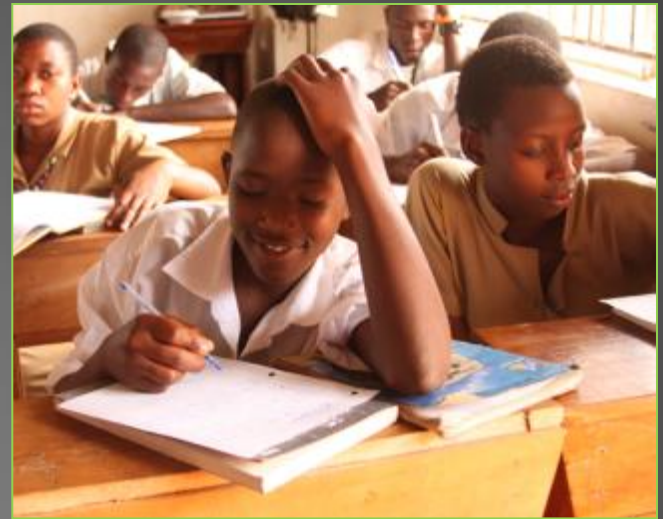


First team arrives to help at new site

AGAPE CHRISTIAN ACADEMY

- ▶ Secondary School (equivalent to our high school)
- ▶ With the children becoming teenagers, the cost for an education increased. A Christian school that would accept day and boarding students who paid tuition made sense, helping begin Agape's road to self sustainability!
- ▶ More buildings would be needed – administration, chapel, boys' and girls' dormitories and teachers' quarters

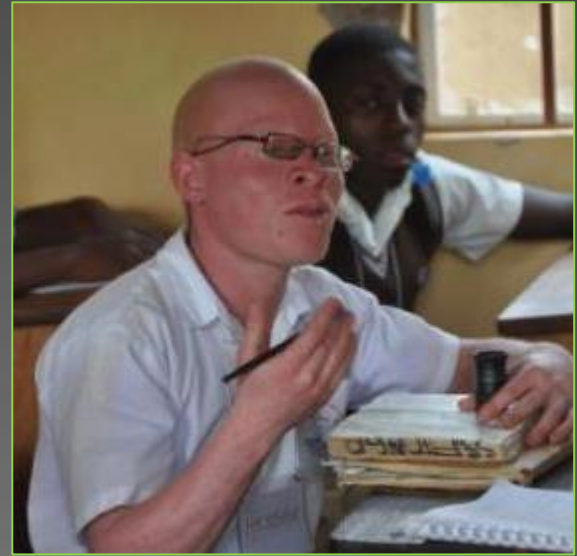

THE ROAD TO SELF SUSTAINABILITY INCLUDES A FARM - 2014

- ▶ Because of a generous donor, Agape was able to purchase a 3.5-acre farm adjoining the Mukono campus.
- ▶ The farm has a house that can be renovated and used in the future for people wanting to serve at Agape for longer periods of time.
- ▶ The farm came with working chicken houses, an eight-stall piggery, a grazing area and a garden spot with fruit trees.

The farm will provide better nutrition for the children; profit for Agape from sales of produce, eggs and meat; and hands-on experience in animal husbandry and agriculture for the children.

We have the land, but need **\$75,000** to build the dormitory. The children of Agape are already making bricks for this project!

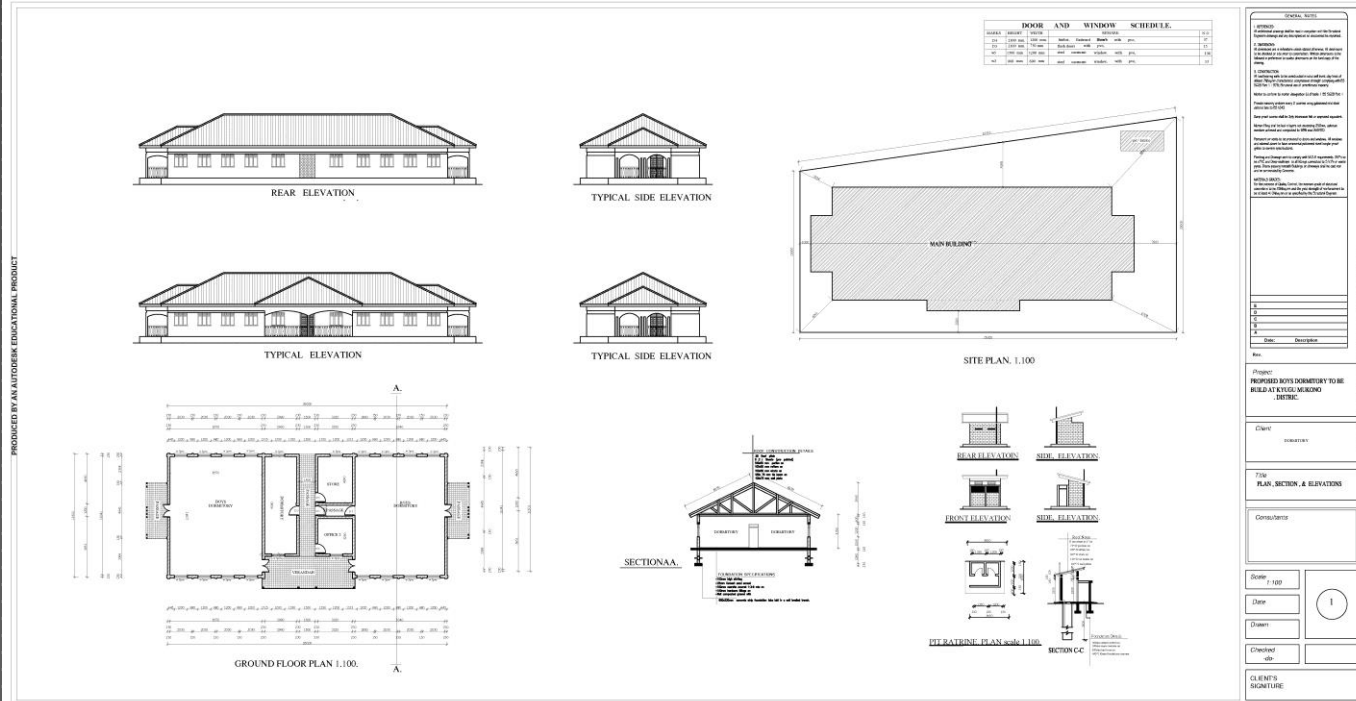
For ACA to meet government accreditation, a boys' dormitory must be built this year!
